Personal History

James Percival TEARE was born at Everton, Liverpool, Lancashire on 23 August 1896 the son of Edward George and Emma Elizabeth TEARE nee SKILLICORN who were married 19/02/1883 at St. Chrysostom, Everton, Liverpool. His father died in 1951. His mother died in 1951.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 368. Stanley Road, Bootle, Liverpool, Lancashire. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Long Avenue, 'Park View,' Aughton, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Liverpool (North Docks) as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Bootle, Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Liverpool, Lancashire. on 14 May 1913 and embarked for France on 7 March 1915. His last known address was Bootle, Liverpool, Stanley Road, 386 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 May 1915 aged 18

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
