Personal History

Harold THOMAS was born at Halifax, Yorkshire on 27 September 1894 the son of James William and Elizabeth Dawson THOMAS nee CARROLL. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 49, Haig Street, Pelton Lane, Halifax,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Jobber, Reeling in Worsted Mill.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 9, Taylor Street, Halifax, Yorkshire,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at
Sowerby Bridge as a Labourer

He enlisted in the West Yorkshire Regiment at Halifax, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 26 August 1915. His last known address was Halifax, Yorkshire, Chatham Street, 19 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 1 August 1916 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
