Personal History

Claude Victor THOMPSON was born at Everton, Liverpool, Lancashire on 18 December 1893 the son of Vanburen Randolph and Sarah THOMPSON nee HOGG who were married 09/05/1870 at St. Nicjholas, Liverpool, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 48A, Thirlmere Road, Liverpool,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Chamois Leather Dresser.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 149, Heyworth Street, Everton, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 8

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Stores Dept. at North Docks as a Sheet Repairer

Service History

He was living at Everton, Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Litherland, Liverpool, Lancs.. and embarked for France on 7 March 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Lancashire, Thirlmere Road, 48A (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 May 1915 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
