## Personal History

Harold THOMPSON was born at Goole, Yorkshire on 12 April 1895 the son of John Willam and Emily THOMPSON. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 76, Marlborough Avenue, Goole, Yorkshire.. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Railway Dock Checker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 63. Queens Avenue, Goole. Yorkshire,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Goole Steam Shipping at Goole as a Labourer

## Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Goole Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 19 August 1915. His last known address was Goole, Yorkshire, Marlborough Avenue, 76 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 24 July 1916 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
