***Personal History***

*Samuel Ethelbert THOMPSON was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1883 the son of Samuel and Ellen THOMPSON nee MCNALLY who were married 1873 at Manchester Cathedral, Lancashire. His father died on .*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 35. Tame Street, Ancoats, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 28 with the occupation of Railway Lorry Driver.*

*In the 1891 census the family were living at 6, Cross Street, Manchester,. He was aged 9 with the occupation of Scholar.*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Oldham Road as a Carter*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.*

*He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 11 February 1915 in 2nd Western Gen. Hosp. Manchester aged 32*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal*
