Personal History

Charles Henry TRELFA was born at Congleton, Cheshire in 1875 the son of James and Maria TRELFA nee BOLSHAW who were married 1875 at St. Stephen, Congleton, Cheshire. His father died in 1908. His mother died in 1908.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 6, Naylor Street, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 35 with the occupation of Painters Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 15, Naylor Street, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 35 with the occupation of Tanners Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 13, Bedson Strteet, Beswick, Prestwich, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Apprentice Turner.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Hannah TRELFA (nee OFFICER) They married at St, Lukes, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire on 9 March 1905. They had children: Elizabeth Ellen b.1895, Violet b.1897, Charles Henry b.1899, Hannah b. 1901, Thomas b.1902

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Castleton as a Platelayer

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 2 June 1915. His last known address was Castleton, Lancashire, Progress Street, 18 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 23 August 1915 aged 40

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
