Personal History

Thomas TINSLEY was born at Ormskirk, Lancashire in 1886 the son of Edward and Mary TINSLEY nee PRESCOTT who were married 1882 at Ormskirk Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1892. His mother died in 1892.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 73, Stamford Road, Southport, Lancashire,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Railway Platelayer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Southport Road, Scarisbrick, Ormskirk, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Carter on Fram.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Carr Cross, Southport Road, Scarisbrick, Ormskirk, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth Ellen TINSLEY (nee MAKINSON) They married at St. Peter, Birkdale, Southport, Lancashire on 12 October 1907. They had children: Winifred May b. 1909, Edna Mary b. 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at St. Lukes as a Platelayer

Service History

He was living at Birkdale. Southport, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Southport, Lancashire. on 20 October 1914 and embarked for France on 19 May 1915. His last known address was Southport, Lancashire, Bedford Road, 7 (Army Records).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 21 March 1918 aged 31

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
