David TOMLINSON was born at Bradford, Yorkshire in 1888 the son of David and Ellen Maud TOMLINSON nee NEALE who were married 1883 at Bradford, Yorkshire. His mother died in 1936.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 77, Ripley Terrace, Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Railway Drayman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 52, Respect Street, Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 12 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 79, Hall Lane, Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 2 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Deopt. at Bradford as a Carter

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Bradford, Yorkshire. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 26 October 1917 aged 28 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
