Personal History

James TOMLINSON was born at Bradford, Yorkshire in 1888 the son of Edward and Margaret TOMLINSON who were married 02/10/1886 at St. Peter, (Bradford Cathedral) Bradford.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 22, Trademens Homes, Manningham, Yorkshire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Steam Motor Wagon Driver.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 83, Victoria Street, Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Office Boy.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 493, Bolton Road, Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 3

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bradford as a Porter and Reseve Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the West Yorkshire Regiment at Bradford, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 19 December 1914. His last known address was Bradford, Yorkshire, Mannington Road, 35 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 11 March 1915 in No. 12 Field Ambulance aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
