Personal History

James (John) TRAFFORD was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1890 the son of John and Mary TRAFFORD nee MITTY who were married 1884 at Our Lady & St. Nicholas & St. Anne, Liverpool. His father died on.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 36. Grange Road, Birkenhead,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Boiler Maker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 56, Grange Road, Birkenhead,. He was aged 10 In the 1891 census the family were living at 33, Balfour Street, Everton, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 10 Months

He was a married man. His wife's name was Jessie TRAFFORD (nee KIRKHAM) They married at St. Luke the Evangalist, Walton on the Hill, Liverpool on 26 March 1905. They had children: Frederick James b. 1913 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Liverpool, as a Washer

Service History

He enlisted in the Worcestershire Regiment at Liverpool, Lancashire, and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 20 September 1914. His last known address was Birkenhead, Gramge Road, 36 (1911 Census). He is recorded as Killed in action on 6 August 1915 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
