Personal History

Frederick George TURNER was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1887 the son of Arthur and Alice TURNER nee RUFFLE who were married 10/01/1884 at St. Mary, Edge Hill, Liverpool, Lancashire. His father died in 1931. His mother died in 1931.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 50, Roscommon Street, Liverpool, Lancashire. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Barman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 50, Roscommon Street, Liverpool, Lancashire. He was aged 14 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Sept. at Liverpool (Sandhills) as a Porter

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 24 February 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Netherfield Road North, 259 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 13 June 1917 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
