***Personal History***

*George Robert TURNER was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1891 the son of Charles and Eleanor Ann TURNER nee GRAHAM who were married 06/06/1886 at St. George, Everton, Liverpool.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at Fazakerley Hospital, Servant, Hospital Porter. He was aged 20*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 57, Greenwich Road, Walton-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 10*

*In the 1891 census the family were living at 76, Brick Road, Walton-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 2 Months*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Fazakerley as a Repairer*

***Service History***

*He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place.*

*He is recorded as Died on 10 June 1917 in Prisoner of War aged 26*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal*
