Personal History

George Robert TURNER was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1891 the son of Charles and Eleanor Ann TURNER nee GRAHAM who were married 06/06/1886 at St. George, Everton, Liverpool.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Fazakerley Hospital, Servant, Hospital Porter. He was aged 20 In the 1901 census the family were living at 57, Greenwich Road, Walton-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 10

In the 1891 census the family were living at 76, Brick Road, Walton-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 2 Months

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Fazakerley as a Repairer

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. He is recorded as Died on 10 June 1917 in Prisoner of War aged 26 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
