Personal History

Harry TYRER was born at Earlestown, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Harriet TYRER nee Tyrer. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 56, Langworthy Road, Moston, Manchester,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Wagon Maker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 109, Crow Lane, Newton-in-Makerfield, Lancashire,. He was aged 7

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath as an Apprentice Wagon Maker

Service History

He was living at Padgate, Warrington when he enlisted in the Border Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 18 July 1915. His last known address was Warrington, Houghton Green, New Road (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 September 1915 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
