Personal History

Arthur VICKERS was born at Levenshulme, Lancashire in 1892 the son of James and Hannah VICKERS nee FAIRCLOUGH who were married 21/09/1889 at All Saints, Heaton Norris. His father died in 1911. His mother died in 1911.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 14, North Street, Openshaw, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Apprentice Fitter.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Manchester Victoria as a Wireman

Service History

He was living at Stockport, Cheshire when he enlisted in the Rifle Brigade at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 24 February 1915. His last known address was Gorton, Manchester, Sandown Street, 28 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 31 October 1915 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
