Personal History

Bannister WALTON was born at Clivedger, Burnley, Lancashire in 1896 the son of Thomas and Ellen WALTON nee SWAINBANK who were married 1886 at St. John the Baptist, Gannow, Preston, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, River Cott. He was aged s with the occupation of Portsmouth, Todmorden, Lancashire, Age 16, Cotton Marker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 13, Copy Bottom, Burnley,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Todmorden, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 4 September 1918 in 3rd Can. Cas Clearing Stn. France aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
