***Personal History***

*Harry Thompson BLAIR was born at Montrose, Forfarshire, Scotland in 1888.*

*He was a married man. His wife's name was Violet BLAIR (nee RIMMER) They married at St. Peter, Fleetwood, Lancashire on . They had children: Gertrude b. 1914, Ronald Percy b. 1916 ?*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Fleetwood as a Fitters Labourer*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster at Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 14 February 1915. His last known address was Fleetwood, Arthur Street, 10 (CWGC).*

*He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 17 September 1917 in 12th Casualty Clearing Station, Belgium aged 29*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
