Harry Thompson BLAIR was born at Montrose, Forfarshire, Scotland in 1888. He was a married man. His wife's name was Violet BLAIR (nee RIMMER) They married at St. Peter, Fleetwood, Lancashire on . They had children: Gertrude b. 1914, Ronald Percy b. 1916? Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Fleetwood as a Fitters Labourer

## Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster at Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 14 February 1915. His last known address was Fleetwood, Arthur Street, 10 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 17 September 1917 in 12th Casualty Clearing Station, Belgium aged 29 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
