Personal History

Harold Fenwick WAUD was born at York, Yorkshire in 1889 the son of Elisha and Catherine WAUD. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 93. Grey Street, North Shields,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Locomotive Draughtsman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 13, Lindley Street, York, Yorkshire,. He was aged 12
In the 1891 census the family were living at 13. Bond Street, York, Yorkshire,. He was aged 2
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath Shops as a Draughtsman

Service History

He enlisted in the Durham Light Infantry. and embarked for France on 11 September 1915. His last known address was Gateshead, Stavordale Terrace, 13 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 August 1917 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
