Personal History

George William WHITE was born at Chelmsford, Essex in 1884 the son of John and Eliza WHITE. In the 1911 census the family were living at 13, Elizabeth Street, Heaton Park, Manchester,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Victoria as a Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 10 November 1915. His last known address was Heaton Park, Manchester, Lancashire, Elizabeth Street, 13 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 14 July 1916 aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
