Personal History

Harry BLEARS was born at Hulme, Manchester in 1894 the son of John and Hannah BLEARS nee GILGRASS who were married 25/12/1887 at St. Matthew, Stretford, Manchester. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 36, Jackson Street, Stretford, Manchester,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of a Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 15, Church Street, Stretford, Manchester,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 4 May 1917 aged 22
