***Personal History***

*Arthur WHITEHEAD was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1896 the son of Joseph and Elizabeth WHITEHEAD nee BOWER. His father died on .*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 39, Albion Terrace, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Labourer, Dye Works.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Almert Street, Manchester,. He was aged 5*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Red Bank as a Lifters Assistant*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 7 September 1915. His last known address was Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire, Albion Terrace, 39 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Died on 6 October 1915 in Accidentally Killed by Bombs aged 19*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
