Personal History

James WHITEHEAD was born at Failsworth, Oldham, Lancashire in 1890 the son of James and Eva Mallalieu WHITEHEAD nee HALLIWELL who were married 1889 at St. John the Evangalist, Oldham, Lancashire. His father died in 1930. His mother died in 1930.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 227. Oldham Road, Failsworth, Lancashire,. He was aged 1 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Scretary's Clerk

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 8 November 1915. His last known address was Failsworth, Oldham, Lancashire, Ashton Road, 26 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 2 April 1917 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
