Personal History

Norman WHITELEGG was born at Farnworth, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Thomas Henry and Annie WHITELEGG nee TAYLOR who were married 1890 at St. Thomas, Dixon Green, Boton, Lancashire. His mother died in 1944.
