Personal History

Henry WHITESIDE was born at Lancaster, Lancashire in 1880 the son of Edward and Margaret WHITESIDE nee MCGUIRE who were married 08/10/1859 at St. Anne, Lancaster, Lancashire. His father died in 1890. His mother died in 1890.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Military, 2nd Battaliom King's Own Royal Lancaster Regt.. He was aged 29 Lance Sergeant

In the 1901 census the family were living at Military, Lancaster Barracks. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Drummer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 131, Leonards Gate, Lancaster, Lancashire.. He was aged 11 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth Annie WHITESIDE (nee BULLOCK) They married at Lancaster Register Office or Registrar Attended on 16 March 1905. They had children: Jane Bullock b. 1902, Doris Irene b.1904, Charles Edward b. 1905, Mary b. 1908

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 23 August 1914. His last known address was Lancaster, Lancashire, Golgotha Road, 37 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died on 12 June 1919 in Home aged 38

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
