Personal History

Emmanuel Thomas WHITMAN was born at Prestion, Lancashire in 1891 the son of Emmanuel Thomas and Ellen WHITMAN nee SHAW who were married 29/05/1882 at St. Luke, Preston, Lancashire. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 37. Portman Street, Prestion, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Railway Carriage Cleaner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 18, Morgan Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 10 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Lostock Hall as a Repairer

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 20 September 1914. His last known address was Preston, Lancashire, Portman Street, 37 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 24 October 1914 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
