Personal History

Joseph WHITTLE was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1882 the son of Elijah and Jane WHITTLE nee FRIERY who were married 20/11/1871 at Manchester Cathedral. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 14, Dean Lane, Newton Heath, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Railway Shunter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 80, Cran. He was aged St. with the occupation of Newton Heath, Man., Lancashire, Age 18, Glass Works Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 17, Queen Street, Newton Heath, Manchester, Lancashire. He was aged 8 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Ellen WHITTLE (nee HAM) They married at St. Luke, Miles Platting, Manchester on 31 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Miles Platting as a Goods Guard

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 15 August 1914. His last known address was Newton Heath, Manchester, Lancashire, Dean Lane, 14 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 28 December 1918 aged 36

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
