Personal History

Lewis WHITTLE was born at Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Bruno and Betsy WHITTLE nee DAGNALL who were married 02/11/1878 at St. James the Apostle, Bolton, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 34, Queen Street, Farnwort, Bolton, Lancashie,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 81, Brackley Street, Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 14 November 1915. His last known address was Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire, Queen Street, 34 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 16 July 1916 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
