Personal History

Henry WHITWORTH was born at Eccles, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Alfred Henry and Harriet WHITWORTH nee LLOYD who were married 1886 at Barton-upon-Irwell Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1916. His mother died in 1916.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 80, Manchester Road, Southport, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Woodlands, Stafford Road, Eccles, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Head Office as a Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment. and embarked for Gallipoli on 8 December 1915. His last known address was Southport, Lancashire, Manchester Road, 80 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 September 1918 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
