Personal History

Samuel Reade BLOOR was born at Macclesfield, Cheshire in 1880 the son of Samuel Elijah and Sarah Ann BLOOR nee READE who were married 1870 at St. Peter, Prestbury, Cheshire. His father died in 1901. His mother died in 1901.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 64, Derwent Street, Ordsall Lane, Salford,. He was aged 31 with the occupation of General Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 7, Brighton Street, Salford,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Railway Carriage Cleaner.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 56, Cavendish Street, Salford,. He was aged 11 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Frances Mary BLOOR (nee DEAKIN) They married at St Bartholemew, Salford on 3 March 1905. They had children: Sara Ann b. 1901, Samuel R.b. 1903 Ada, b. 1905, Jane, b. 1907, Olive b. 1909, Elizabeth b. 1911, Jane b. 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Victoria as a Washer

Service History

He was living at Salford, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Wigan, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 6 May 1915. His last known address was Salford, Ordsall Lane, Derwent Street, 64 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 March 1918 aged 38

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
