Personal History

James WILDE was born at Rochdale, Lancashire in 1874 the son of Joseph and Elizabeth WILDE.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Dixon Street, Sudden Rochdale,. He was aged 36 with the occupation of General Labourer Textile Foundry.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Sarah Catherine WILDE (nee JONES) They married at St. Chad, Rochdale, Lancashire on 17 March 1905. They had children: Elizabeth b. 1904, Oswald b. 1906, Florence b. 1908

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Rochdale as an Extra Chain Horse Youth

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 11 July 1915. His last known address was Rochdale, Lancashire, Sdixon Street, 4 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 27 September 1916 aged 42

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
