Personal History

Fred WILLIAMS was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1897 the son of Ann Jane WILLIAMS nee Williams. In the 1911 census the family were living at Langtree Cott. He was aged with the occupation of Glover Brow, Kirkby, Liverpool, Lancashire, Age 13, Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Kirkby Station, Kirkby, Liverpool.. He was aged 3 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Kirkby as a Weigher

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps (Motors) at Coventry. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 30 April 1918 aged 20
