***Personal History***

*William BLUCK was born at Barrow in Furness in 1891 the son of William and Mary Jane BLUCK nee MCCLOY who were married 1888 at Barrow in Furness Register Office or registrar Attended..*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 50, Marsden Street, Barrow in Furness,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Apprentice Coach Trimmer.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 9, Railway Cott. He was aged 10 with the occupation of Newby Bridge, Age 10.*

*In the 1891 census the family were living at 30, Argyle Street, Barrow in Furness -. He was aged 3 months Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath Shop as a Trimmer*

***Service History***

*He was living at Barrow in Furness when he enlisted in the Army Service Corps at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 27 September 1915. His last known address was Barrow in Furness, Marsden Street, 50 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Died on 13 October 1918 aged 27*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
