Personal History

George BLUNDELL was born at Preston, Lancashire on 1880? the son of George and Margaret BLUNDELL nee HOOD who were married 1873 at St. John's, Preston.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 62, Haydock Street, Preston, Boarder,. He was aged

In the 1891 census the family were living at 31, Nelson Street, Preston,. He was aged d 10 with the occupation of Labourer in Biscuit Works.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie Blundell BLUNDELL (nee SWARBRICK) They married at St. Mark, Preston on 1 November 1908. They had children: Ethel b.1910, Albert b.1911, George b. 1912. Margaret b. 1913, Elizabeth b. 1914.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Preston as a Sheeter

Service History

He was living at Preston, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at the same place. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 22 September 1914. His last known address was Preston, Haydock Street, 62 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 22 December 1914

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal

Remarks

Previously 6273 Loyal North Lancashire Regiment. One of BEF sent out at start of hostilities. Reported missing 22 Dec 1914.
