## Personal History

William Caddy WILSON was born at St. Mary's, Lancaster in 1895 the son of Richard John and Selina WILSON nee CADDY who were married 1895 at St. Giles, Haughton Stafford, Staffordshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 39, Brook Street, Clitheroe, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 13. Allinson Street, Clitheroe, Lancashire,. He was aged 5 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Chatburn as a Platelayer

## Service History

He enlisted in the Cameronians Scottish Rifles at Clitheroe, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 12 May 1915. His last known address was Clitheroe, Lancashirem Brook Street, 39 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 September 1915 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
