Personal History

Albert Edred WOOD was born at Guisborough, Yorkshire in 1897 the son of John Frederick and Margaret WOOD nee JONES who were married 1892 at All Saints, Great Ayton, Northallerton.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 16, S(L)aing Street, Grangetown, Yorkshire. He was aged 14

In the 1901 census the family were living at Guisborough, Yorkshire,. He was aged 4

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Halifax as a Train Booker

Service History

He was living at Pinchinthorpe, Yorkahire when he enlisted in the Rifle Brigade at Stokesley, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 16 June 1915. His last known address was Grangetown, Yorkshire, S(L)aing Street, 16, (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 16 July 1915 in 8th Clearing Station, France aged 18

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
