Personal History

Parkin WOODALL was born at Newport, Yorkshire in 1878 the son of David and Alice WOODALL nee COULTISH who were married 1875 at Howden, Yorkshire. His father died in 1939. His mother died in 1939. In the 1911 census the family were living at 5, Burlington Square, Burligton Crescent, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 32 with the occupation of Railway Horse Shunter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Gwenthorpe House, Blakloft,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Horseman on Farm.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Stand Holme Lane Landing, Cross Lane,. He was aged 12

He was a married man. His wife's name was Grace Elizabeth (d.1915) WOODALL (nee GAMWELL) They married at Howden, Yorkshire on 17 March 1905. They had children: Sarah A. b. 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. as a Shunt Horse Driver

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Goole, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 29 November 1915. His last known address was Newport, Brough, East Yorkshire, West Canal Bank (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 15 November 1916 aged 38

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
