Personal History

John WOODS was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1886 the son of Duncan and Mary Ann WOODS nee SPENCER who were married 01/03/1865 at St. Nichollas, Liverpool, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 61, Inison Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 28 with the occupation of Railway Signalman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 110, Selwyn Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool, Lancashire. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Wines and Spirits Sales.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 110, Selwyn Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 6

He was a married man. His wife's name was Maud Hannah WOODS (nee JACKSON) They married at St. George, Everton, Lancashire on 2 September 1906. They had children: John b. 1909, William Spencer b. 1910 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Kirkdale as a Signalman

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 29 December 1915. His last known address was Walton, Liverpool, Imison Street, 64 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 1 August 1916 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
