He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Blackburn, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 21 December 1914. His last known address was Audley, Blackburn. Lancashire, Cromwell Terrace, 13 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 28 August 1917 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
