Harry Anderson Clifford WOODWARD was born at Dewsbury, Yorkshire in 1894 the son of William and Ellen WOODWARD.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Well Green Cott. He was aged s with the occupation of Dewsbury Road, Ossett, Yorkshire, Age 17, Colliery Scale Picker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Dewsbury Road, Ossett,. He was aged 7 (Adpopted Son) Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Thornhill as a Platelayer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Ossett, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 13 April 1916. His last known address was Ossett, Yorkshire (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 19 December 1915 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
