Personal History

Hugh Vaughan WOOLLEY was born at Blackburn, Lancashire in 1892 the son of Richard Vaughan and Sarah Caroline WOOLLEY nee HUME who were married 25/12/1891 at St. John the Evangelist, Everton, Lancashire. His father died in 1941. His mother died in 1941.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 13, Ewood Bridge, Hollin Bank, Darwen, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Cotton Lab..

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Farmers Road, Darwen, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Lower Darwen as a Waher Out

Service History

He enlisted in the Borderer Regiment at Blackburn, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 10 December 1915. His last known address was Darwen, Blackburn, Lancashire, Hollin Bank, Ewood Bridge, 13 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 23 October 1916 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
