Personal History

Samuel WORMALD was born at Pudsey, Leeds, Yorkshire in 1886 the son of Tom and Margaret Hannah WORMALD nee HAINSWORTH who were married 04/05/1884 at St. Wilfrid, Calverley, Yorkshire. His father died in 1909. His mother died in 1909.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, Rosemount Terrace, The Lanes, Pudsey, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Machine Minder Woollen Mill.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 5, Hill Side Mount, Bramley, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 5 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Manchester (Police Dept.) as a Constable

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Royal Rifle Corps at Bradford, Yorkshire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 26 August 1915. His last known address was Bradford, Yorkshire, Oliver Street, 25 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 17 September 1914 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
