### ***Personal History***

*Thomas BOARDMAN was born at Reddish, Manchester in 1880 the son of John and Mary Ann BOARDMAN nee ANDERTON who were married 1864 at St. John, Bolton.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 52, Dickinson Street West, Horwich,. He was aged 30 with the occupation of Railway Labourer.*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich*

### ***Service History***

*He was living at Horwich when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 22 September 1914. His last known address was Horwich, Dickinson Street, 52 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 5 November 1914 aged 34*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal*
