Personal History

Henry WROE was born at Newton, Manchester in 1896 the son of Henry and Margaret WROE nee TAYLOR who were married 1892 at St. Mark, Old Newton, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 10, Prior Street, Oldham Road, Manchester,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Tinsmith Learning.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Naylor Street, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. as a Painters Labourer

Service History

He was living at Miles Platting, Manchester when he enlisted in the Rifle Brigade at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 19 May 1915. His last known address was Miles Platting, Manchester, Oldham Road, Holland Street, 127 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 3 December 1917 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
