927 1st/6th Battalion King's Liverpool Regiment

Died of Wounds 9 October 1916 aged 26

Buried Liverpool (Anfield) Cemetery, England Grave IV. C. 641

Not named on Victoria Station War Memorial

Personal History

Arthur GRIFFITHS was born at Rock Ferry, Birkenhead, Cheshire in 1891 the son of William Hargreaves and Lily GRIFFITHS nee LEE who were married 1878 at West Derby, Liverpool Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died in 1934. His mother died in 1934.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 6, Hunters Lane, Wavertree, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Apprentice Quantity Surveyor.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 7, Berkley Street, Toxteth Park, Liverpool,. He was aged 11

In the 1891 census the family were living at 43, Grove Road, Tranmerer, Birkrnhead,. He was aged 1

He was a married man. His wife's name was Agnes GRIFFITHS (nee BUSBY) They married at Chester Congregational Chapel (Upper Northgate Street) on 29 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 24 February 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Wavertree, Hunters Lane 6 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 9 October 1916 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
