Personal History

William Frederick BONE was born at Congleton, Cheshire in 1886 the son of James and Annie BONE nee TOPHAM who were married 1883 at Congleton Civil Marriage or Registrar Attended. His mother died in 1890.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Oak Cott. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Styal, Wilmslow, Cheshire, Age 15, Cotton Weaver.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 12, Bridge Street, Congleton, Cheshire,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Edith May Bone BONE (nee HYDE) They married at Salford Assension Church on 7 April 1910. They had children: James Harry b. 17/11/1910, Percy William b. 23/11/1911

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent Of The Line Dept. at Salford as a Goods Guard

Service History

He enlisted in the Cheshire Regiment at Stockport, Cheshire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 16 August 1914. His last known address was Salford, Broughton, Chestnut Street, 1 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 24 August 1914 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
