Personal History

Herbert Shackleton PROCTOR was born at Beeston, Leeds, Yorkshire on 28 March 1892 the son of James Francis and Jane PROCTOR nee PEARSON who were married 01/02/1890 at St. Peter, Leeds, Yorkshire. His father died in 1946. His mother died in 1946.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 41, Oldfield Street, Wortley, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Railway Engine Cleaner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 41, Oldfield Street, Wortley, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 8 He was a married man. His wife's name was Emily PROCTOR (nee SIMPSON) They married at St. George, Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire on 11 April 1914. They had children: Norman b. 1915

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Sowerby Bridge as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the West Ridings Regiment at Halifax, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 26 August 1915. His last known address was Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire, West Street, 23 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 22 November 1915 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
