Personal History

Charles Edwin SPEAKMAN was born at St. Helens, Lancashire the son of James Octavious and Elizabeth SPEAKMAN nee POTTER who were married 14/03/1891 at Christ Church, Eccleston, Lancashire. His father died in 1917. His mother died in 1917.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 22, Silkstone Street, St. Helens, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Bottle Makers Apprentice.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 18, Chorley Street, St. Helens, Lancashire,. He was aged Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich

Service History

He enlisted in the South Lancashire Regiment at St. Helens, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 30 December 1917 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
