Personal History

George William WILSON was born at Old Hartlepool, Durham in 1873.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 21, Third Street, Burrow Bridge, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 39 with the occupation of Railway, Plate Moulder.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 12, Prospect Place, Skelton, Yorkshire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Driver in ?.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Alice WILSON (nee FRYER) They married at St. George The Martyr, Bolton, Lancashire on 16 March 1905. They had children: Emma b. 1906, Lucy b. 1911 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Bolton, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 9 April 1918 aged 45 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
