Personal History

Frederick Charles WILSHIRE was born at Woolwich, London in 1891 the son of Frederick and Alice WILSHIRE nee CLARKE. His father died on .

In the 1891 census the family were living at 16, Mulgraves Place, Woolwich, Kent,. He was aged 1 month He was a married man. His wife's name was Eliza Jenning WILSHIRE (nee CLARKE) They married at St. Paul, Manningham, Yorkshire on 6 September 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Manningham, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the West Yorkshire Regiment at Bradford, Yorkshire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 19 May 1917 in No.7 Cam Casualty Clearing Stn. aged 26
He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
